



A directory of the elections taking place in May 2019

Local council elections will take place on Thursday May 2nd 2019 for 273 English metropolitan borough councils, unitary authorities and second-tier district councils. Also on the same day there will be Mayoral elections in Bedford, Copeland, Leicester, Mansfield and Middlesbrough.

This directory, an annual production of TUSC which was referenced by the House of Commons Library in 2016, provides a breakdown of the councils being contested in May, the number of councillors up for election, and the current political control in each council listed.

There are 161 councils with 'all-up' contests, with every councillor up for election, usually in multi-seat wards. Elections in the other authorities will be for one-third of the councillors in single-seat contests but there are some which normally elect by thirds which are holding 'all-up' elections this year following ward boundary changes.

The council seats up for election this year were last contested in 2015. Since then sixteen councils – Bassetlaw, Birmingham, Bristol, Doncaster, Gloucester, Great Yarmouth, Harrogate, Hertsmere, Huntingdonshire, Newcastle-under-Lyme, Rotherham, South Cambridgeshire, Stratford-on-Avon, Stroud, Warrington and West Lindsey – have moved or are moving this year from annual elections to four-yearly 'all-up' contests, to 'save money'. That there is an even spread between right-wing Labour led-administrations and Tory ones that have taken this step shows the contemptuous attitude to democracy common to both.

Of the 273 councils holding elections next May 78 are currently Labour-led, with Labour holding an overall majority or the largest party in a coalition administration; 158 have Tory-administrations; and six are headed by the Liberal Democrats.

There are still ongoing boundary reviews to be factored but a current estimate is that next May will see 9,189 councillors elected in 5,665 wards.

And lastly the directory includes, from page 13, a list of 429 councillors who signed the Open Letter in support of Owen Smith's leadership coup against

Jeremy Corbyn in the summer of 2016 who are councillors in local authorities with elections next May.

Not all of these councillors are necessarily up for election themselves – even if they haven't been deselected by their local party! – as many of them are in councils with 'one-third' contests in 2019. But 168 are in councils with 'all-up' elections, so they will definitely be on the ballot paper in May 2019 if they are standing again.
