



The May 2026 elections results report

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Summary overview

The report this year on the May elections, an annual production of the Trade Unionist and Socialist Coalition (TUSC) steering committee every time candidates with a TUSC-registered description have appeared on the ballot paper since 2011, is very much a statistical digest.

It presents in detail the results achieved by the nearly 750 candidates who stood in the various contests on May 7th – advertised on the TUSC website prior to polling day (see [here](#)) – who could properly be described as anti-austerity and anti-war candidates standing outside of the ‘big five’ mainstream parties of Labour, Conservative, Reform, Liberal Democrat and the Greens (and the SNP and Plaid Cymru in Scotland and Wales).

This is not because there are no broader questions to analyse from what were, undoubtedly, seminal elections – far from it! What is the significance of the gains for Reform and the Greens, the Plaid Cymru surge in Wales and the election of the biggest-ever bloc of pro-independence MSPs to Holyrood, and, above all, the crushing defeat for Keir Starmer’s Tory-retread ‘Labour government’ – all are vital issues for socialists and the workers’ movement to assess as the task of rebuilding working class political representation is debated.

But this year was the biggest ‘outside the mainstream’ election challenge – the biggest ‘data dump’ of results that we have had to process – since over 800 candidates contested the local and general elections on the same day in 2015 (polling a combined total of 163,517 votes). So gathering that information together was the first job to be done.

Raw statistics, of course, still leave much to be discussed. In the run up to the elections, for example, TUSC argued that the danger of a fragmented election campaign by a mix of independents and different registered parties – there are 25 separate parties registered with the Electoral Commission included in this report – was that any local highlights achieved would not be properly recognised nationally.

“Think, for example, what the narrative will be from the elections on May 8th”, we wrote in February in an [appeal to Your Party](#) supporters, if even the best results won “are buried in the ‘others’ column?” While Reform, and the Greens positioning as the ‘progressive alternative’ to Starmer’s Labour, “are portrayed as the gainers”. And isn’t what has happened since polling day precisely the ‘burying’ of the best results?

The Greens increased their tally of councillors by 441 on May 7th, with national fanfare. But how widely is it known that the total vote secured by all the candidates listed in this report reached 441,314 and that over a hundred (102) of the candidates were elected?

There is much more information to be gathered and assessed. There are, undoubtedly, many other issues to discuss from the May polls. But the report makes a start. And factually grounding the debates about what needs to be done next is a vital first step. ■

Some summary points from the results include:

- The total vote for all the left independent candidates and those from TUSC, local community parties registered with the Electoral Commission, and other left-wing organisations on May 7th was 441,314.

- One hundred and one councillors were elected from the candidates listed here, representing nine different registered parties – 32 Aspire councillors in Tower Hamlets along with the directly-elected mayor; 24 Newham Independent Party councillors; nine Redbridge Independents; nine for the Your Bradford Independents party; five Lydiate and Maghull Independents on Sefton council; five Workers Party councillors (in Birmingham, Bury, Calderdale, and two in Rochdale); three for the Kingston Independent Residents Group, and one each from the Camden People's Alliance and the Harrow Arise parties. And twelve with a straight 'Independent' description.
- The anger with Labour of workers and others from a Muslim background remains unabated. All but ten of the 101 candidates listed here that were elected – the exceptions being Bingley on the outskirts of Bradford, the Lydiate and Maghull independents in Sefton, Hastings, and the Kingston councillors – represent wards with a Muslim population of 20% or more.
- Thirty-six of the candidates elected were sitting councillors, with an established reputation in their area. But still, of the candidates listed in this report, 18 were sitting councillors who lost their seats to Reform (in Coventry, Dudley, Hastings, Wakefield, Walsall, and West Lancashire) or because of surging support for the Greens (in Bradford, Hackney, Hastings and Islington) as national trends overrode the impact of the work they had done in the local community.
- The best results for candidates appearing with a TUSC description on the ballot paper were in Southampton's Bevois ward, with Nadia Ditta's 739 votes (23.8%) securing second place – also affected by the Green surge siphoning off votes to help Labour win – and a 19.4% vote for third place in Knowsley's Northwood ward.
- The best results for candidates appearing with the Your Party name on the ballot paper were in Birmingham council's Small Heath ward, in second place behind the Liberal Democrats with a 24.1% share, and in West Lancashire, with the sitting councillor Ron Cooper securing a third place finish with 17.9%.

A note on statistical methods

The results tables include a figure for the percentage of the vote won by TUSC in each council ward contested.

How this figure is worked out is straightforward in a contest for one seat – the percentage figure for the TUSC candidate being the percentage of all the valid votes that were cast.

But what about multi-seat contests, where two, three or more councillors are elected from the same ward? Particularly, for example, where the council only publishes the votes cast for each candidate but not the turnout, or the size of the electorate? How to present such results, particularly where a party fields just one candidate in a two or three-seat contest, is a controversial question of psephology. TUSC has been using the same method to calculate votes in multi-seat wards since the elections in 2011, which has the advantage of allowing a comparison across different years' election results.

In an example from the elections of 2011, in Leicester's three-seat Rushey Mead ward the single TUSC candidate polled 272 votes, ahead of one Liberal Democrat candidate but behind the other two. It was a fact that of the 5,524 people who voted in Rushey Mead (the turnout figures were published on this occasion) 4.9% of them used one of their three votes for TUSC. But they actually cast a total of 13,917 votes (which meant incidentally that 2,655 potential votes were not used, with some people only voting for one or two candidates). So how should TUSC's share of support in the ward be calculated?

It could have been presented as a percentage of the total votes cast, 1.9%, and some councils do publish the figures in this way. But that doesn't give a rounded representation of a party's support. The three Labour candidates, for example, between them received 7,990 votes, but that is more than the number of people (5,524 remember) who voted. On the other hand, if all the candidates' votes were presented as a percentage of the 5,524 actual voters, the total number of potential votes (if all were used) would be 300%.

So the method used is to record the TUSC vote (or the highest TUSC vote in a multi-seat ward with more than one TUSC candidate) as a percentage of the aggregate of the highest votes of all the parties contesting the ward, the highest vote being taken as a maximum expression of a particular party's support.

In the Rushey Mead example there wasn't much deviation from the percentage of ballots cast method. The aggregate of the highest Labour vote (2,789), the highest Independent (1,039), the Tories' highest vote (861), the top Lib Dem vote (556), and TUSC's 272 votes, came to a total of 5,517. On this calculation, TUSC again polled 4.9% in the ward.

This method is neither a 'correct' nor 'incorrect' way of presenting the support there for TUSC. It is just another method, with its limitations openly acknowledged.

Results using a TUSC descriptor

Listed are the votes received by every council candidate who appeared using one of the TUSC-registered descriptions on the ballot paper on May 7th, with a percentage of the vote figure given for the candidate (see Note on Statistical Methods for how this was calculated in multi-seat wards).

There were 288 council candidates contesting seats in 63 local authorities in England, whose results are presented here in a regional breakdown, including for the directly-elected mayors of Croydon, Lewisham and Tower Hamlets.

All of the candidates stood in tier one or two local authorities with scheduled elections this year bar the one candidate contesting a casual council by-election in Gloucestershire that was called to run concurrently with the May polls. ■

Other left council candidate results

Listed below are the results of other anti-austerity and anti-war local election candidates on May 7th – that TUSC was aware of, and advertised on the TUSC website – including Your Party candidates, independents and other left-wing organisations.

It does not include, obviously, every individual who appeared as an 'Independent' on the ballot paper. As the establishment parties become ever more discredited, candidates who previously could well have stood on their behalf are increasingly appearing in local elections under different banners or as 'Independents'. This year's contests in 136 English councils confirmed that trend.

The best estimate, from the ElectionMaps website, is that 828 candidates had a straight 'Independent' description in May's polls – or no description at all on the ballot paper – with a further 669 appearing for local independent groups with a city, town or district-based extra description, registered as a 'political party' as legally required with the Electoral Commission. (Registering as a 'party' is the only way any description can be used on the ballot paper other than Independent).

The big majority of these were, in reality, establishment party candidates by another name in that they did not seek to challenge the 'rigged system' but merely to manage it 'better', or 'more fairly' they might claim, than 'the political parties' do.

Certainly, the 'Independent' label in itself says nothing about what a candidate stands for. Nearly 200 of the councillors who won their seats in this four-yearly cycle of elections in May 2022 stood, for example, as 'Independents' or 'Residents' – more than the number of Greens elected then – and have sat as such in their councils since while presiding over cuts and other austerity measures. Such candidates do not constitute the new vehicle for working class political representation that the times require nor, in most cases, are they a step towards its formation.

Independents with a difference

The individuals listed in this report however were those who had been recommended for support by local constituent organisations of TUSC and others, who could properly be described as anti-austerity and anti-war candidates who stood as Independents or for registered local community parties. It includes those candidates who appeared on the ballot paper as Your Party, individuals standing as independents backed by Your Party, and a list of the local independent groups that were endorsed by Your Party. It also includes other independents – individuals and local groups – who have been in and around Your Party even if they were not formally endorsed this time.

The final set of candidates are those from other left-wing organisations who chose not to utilise the TUSC descriptions that were available to them – with the right under the TUSC coalition rules to promote their own organisation in their election material – but to appear separately on the ballot paper with other descriptions registered with the Electoral Commission. ■

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Local groups backed by Your Party
