

## Elections 2026:

# Your Party, independents, and other left-wing council candidates on May 7th

As the establishment parties become ever more discredited, candidates who previously could well have stood on their behalf are increasingly appearing in local elections under different banners or as 'Independents'. This year's contests in 136 English councils confirm that trend.

The best estimate, from the ElectionMaps website, is that 828 candidates will have a straight 'Independent' description in May's polls – or no description at all on the ballot paper – with a further 669 appearing for local independent groups with a city, town or district-based extra description, registered as a 'political party' as legally required with the Electoral Commission. (Registering as a 'party' is the only way any description can be used on the ballot paper other than Independent).

The big majority of these will be, in reality, establishment party candidates by another name in that they do not seek to challenge the 'rigged system' but merely to manage it 'better', or 'more fairly' they might claim, than 'the political parties' do.

Certainly, the 'Independent' label in itself says nothing about what a candidate stands for. Nearly 200 of the councillors who won their seats in this four-yearly cycle of elections in May 2022 stood, for example, as 'Independents' or 'Residents' – more than the number of Greens elected then – and have sat as such in their councils since while presiding over cuts and other austerity measures. Such candidates do not constitute the new vehicle for working class political representation that the times require nor, in most cases, are they a step towards its formation.

### Independents with a difference

The individuals listed in this report however are those who have been recommended for support by local constituent organisations of TUSC and others, who could properly be described as anti-austerity and anti-war candidates who are standing as Independents or for registered local community parties. It includes those candidates who are appearing on the ballot paper as Your Party, individuals standing as independents backed by Your Party, and a list of the local independent groups that have been endorsed by Your Party. It also includes other independents – individuals and local groups – who have been in and around Your Party even if they were not formally endorsed this time.

The final set of candidates listed here for voters' information are those from other left-wing organisations; including the Communist Party of Britain, politically linked to the *Morning Star* newspaper, the Workers Party and members of other socialist groups, who have chosen not to utilise the TUSC descriptions that were available to them – with the right under the TUSC coalition rules to promote their own organisation in their election material – but to appear separately on the ballot paper with other descriptions registered with the Electoral Commission.

The total number of socialist or left independent candidates as listed standing on May 7th, plus the 289 using one of the TUSC descriptions on the ballot paper, is 724 – a different choice for almost one in seven of the seats being contested. ■

## Local groups backed by Your Party

The Your Party website also includes a list of locally-based community groups it is backing on May 7th which are registered with the Electoral Commission as formal parties, including with their own name which they are using on the ballot paper this time round.

The process involved the local groups applying for endorsement on the basis that they “share a commitment” with Your Party to “opposition to cuts and local government austerity” and support “the Palestine Solidarity Campaign councillor pledge pushing for full divestment from Israeli apartheid” (see [here](#)). Endorsement by Your Party, as explained by the Political Officer Louise Regan, was not to “be taken as a blanket endorsement of all individual candidates” but is still an indicator of why they are included below.

Where the Your Party-endorsed local groups are previously established electoral parties contesting widely across their council area – Aspire in Tower Hamlets, the Newham Independents Party, and the Redbridge Independents – all the individual candidates have not been listed here just the total for the council.

### Arise

A registered party which is standing eleven candidates in the London Borough of Harrow, including a former local councillor and 2019 Labour parliamentary candidate, Pamela Fitzpatrick.

## Newham Independents Party

The Newham Independents have been a registered party since 2024, with four sitting councillors in the east London borough. This year they are standing for all 66 seats across the council's 24 wards and a candidate, Mehmood Mirza, for the directly-elected Newham mayoralty.

## North Tyneside Community Independents

The North Tyneside Community Independents fielded a candidate in the borough council's 2025 directly-elected mayoral contest, a former Labour councillor, Cath Davis – polling 1,780 votes (3.3%) – who now sits

on the Your Party central executive committee. This year the group is standing one candidate, in the Forest Hall ward.
